TECHNIQUE:

CC and MLO views of the breasts are obtained bilaterally.

COMMENTS:

There are no comparison studies available.

The breasts are very dense, and there are no previous mammograms, which limits mammographic sensitivity. There is a port or central line catheter seen in right axillary region, noted on the MLO view overlapping the structures in this region. No definite mass or suspicious microcalcification, skin or nipple change is seen.

IMPRESSION:

- There is no definite mammographic evidence of malignancy.
- Very dense breasts without comparison studies limiting sensitivity. Comparison to previous mammograms would be helpful to assure stability of dense parenchymal pattern.
